



Tamdeen Youth Foundation - By Numbers






Map of our work in Yemen

Construction of a concrete water tank

This project has received great attention from the local authority and has been prioritised to reduce the water crisis in lbb, which is the third governorate in Yemen in terms of population and the third in terms of the need for water services.




Paving a stone road in Jabla district that connects 4 isolated areas in Jabla district

It facilitated mobility, access to vital markets and public services in the area such as hospitals and schools, created job opportunities, and contributed to supporting local development.

Building a fence to protect the groundwater feeding caravan, in Al-Mashnah District

The fence extends for about 420 metres in length and 1.5 metres in height, enhancing the role of the caravan in maximizing the use of rainwater and reserving about 100,000 cubic metres of water annually to recharge the underground reservoir of the governorate.

Drilling a water well in Anamer down in Al-Mashna district.

This project provided a safe source of water and contributed to improving public health and reducing diseases related to contaminated water.

It was suffering from damage and cracks in its walls, hindering the drainage of rainwater, threatening the collapse of the walls, and posing an obstacle to the mobility of residents in the area.

Rehabilitation of the Al-Khair Educational Complex in the Hadhran area of Al-Ta'ziyah district.

6 new classrooms were built with their annexes, to accommodate the increasing number of students, improve infrastructure, reduce the gender gap in education, and take into account services for people with special needs.

This project provided a sustainable solution to the acute shortage of classrooms that forced parents to educate their children in private buildings adjacent to the school as a temporary solution.

Establishment of the Dialysis Centre at Yarim public Hospital in Yarim District

This centre represents a quantum leap in healthcare, opening a window of hope for kidney failure patients in lbb and neighbouring governorates who struggle to receive regular dialysis sessions.

The centre is equipped with 5 dialysis units and a water treatment plant, allowing it to receive up to 208 patients per month, in addition to providing medical consultation services for kidney failure patients.

Concrete paving of the street linking Al-Zabiya - Al-Aslaf - Main Street, Jiblah district.

This road was a major obstacle of the movement of people and access to essential goods and services. Thanks to this project, life and recovery returned to the centre of the directorate, linking the western districts with the centre, facilitating access to services and public facilities, and contributing to the activation of the economic movement in the area.





Rehabilitation of pumping lines for the Waraf Water Project, Jabla District.

A 4-inch diameter pipe was installed from the well source in Al Sibel Ib to the water tank in the district with a length of 2,400 metres, facilitating the transfer of clean water and providing a sustainable and safe source for the local population.

Concrete paving of the street linking 22 May and Akmat Issa in Al Mashneh district

With a length of 607 metres and an area of 4207 square metres, in addition to the rehabilitation of the sewage network, the project solved the issue of traffic congestion, facilitated access to public services and facilities, stimulated economic movement in the area, improved community health and preserved the environment

Restoration and rehabilitation of the Industrial Technical Institute in Yarim district

The work included equipping the institute:

- Restoration and rehabilitation of the building, classrooms and its annexes.
- Providing 500 school seats and furniture for administrative offices.
- Providing computers (49 devices) with their accessories to the computer lab, graphics and decoration, in addition to 6 desktops.
- -Printers, photocopiers, digital cameras, interactive displays, and sound systems.
- 15 sewing machines and 4 modern electric embroidery machines with related tools.
- -Supporting mechanical, electrical and carpentry workshops with modern equipment and tools.
- Installing a solar energy system and maintaining water harvesting tanks to meet the needs of the institute.

Rehabilitation of the public street in the city of Al-Qaeda, Dhi Al-Safal District

This vital street is a main artery linking Taiz and Ibb governorates, and was suffering from deteriorating asphalt and sewage overflows.

This project contributed to improving infrastructure, facilitating traffic, promoting economic and commercial activity, and addressing a chronic issue that was threatening the lives of the city's residents.

Rehabilitation and furnishing of the Commercial Technical Institute, Al Dhahar District

The rehabilitation process included renovating the entire infrastructure, including classrooms and administrative facilities, and improving the water and sewage network.

In addition, the institute was provided with an advanced space measuring device, 20 modern computers for the computer lab, and the midwifery and nursing lab was equipped with all the necessary models and devices.

The institute also received 194 study and office chairs, six L-shaped desks, three printers, three projectors, and three 92-inch interactive screens to support educational activities.

Development of the automotive maintenance workshop at the Industrial Technical Institute in Al-Hoban, Taiziyah District

The workshop was provided with the latest educational equipment covering various aspects of automotive maintenance, including testing devices for petrol and diesel engines, brake, suspension and power steering systems in cars, and devices for checking fuel injection and exhaust gas systems, as well as advanced diagnostic equipment and computers equipped with modern maintenance software, in addition to providing training materials, user manuals and technical documents to support continuous learning, in addition, the Survey and Planning Department was provided with the latest Total Statio surveying device for the department's needs.




Rehabilitation of 22 May School in Israr isolation in Mawiya district

The project included the renovation of 3 classrooms, with teachers' accommodation, administration and storage, the completion of the construction of 3 other classrooms, and the provision of all the basic needs of the school: Seats and furniture, water harvesting tank, toilets, and solar energy.

Rehabilitation of Qutaiba School in Amama isolation in Mawiya district

The works included renovating 6 classrooms, providing them with chairs, rehabilitation of three bathrooms, allocating a separate bathroom for people with special needs, building a rainwater harvesting tank, beautifying the school yard with trees, providing it with a solar energy system and building a temporary classroom

Supply and installation of a solar pumping system for the Al-Akhloud water project in Maqbana district

The project included levelling the site, building bases and structures on solid ground, installing a solar power system with a total capacity of 55 kilowatts, and installing a protective fence for the system.

The solar energy system produces 174 cubic metres of water per day, replacing the old pumping generators that were powered by expensive and environmentally harmful diesel fuel.

Supply and installation of a solar pumping system for the Mashawz water project in Maqbana district

The diesel engine was replaced with a 55 kW integrated solar energy system, a retaining wall was built to protect the system from the risk of flood, and the community committee was trained to operate and maintain the system and manage the project.

Restoration of Martyr Mohammed Hamra School in Hajda, Maqbana District

This school was prioritised by the local authorities, as it was one of the most prominent schools in the area, receiving more than 1,000 students annually. However, the conflict affected its structure and led to its deterioration, which negatively impacted education in the area.

With the success of the restoration, the school was revived and rehabilitated to provide a safe and stimulating learning environment for students

Rehabilitating and furnishing the Women's Development Centre in Al-Ta'ziyah district



The rehabilitation process included providing the centre with 34 sewing machines, in addition to full office furniture, providing a suitable learning environment to develop their skills and increase their employment opportunities. It enables the centre to promote women's positive participation in income-generating activities and develop the local economy.

During 2024, Tamdeen Youth Foundation continued to lead the Civil Society Organizations Localization and Response Improvement Initiative in Yemen. The initiative aims to strengthen localization efforts, enhance the response system in Yemen, and empower local organizations to lead the response to the needs of their communities.

2024 Achievements:

- Held a national online conference to review the localization performance measurement methodology. The event brought together over 40 representatives from 30 organizations across Yemen, including Hadramout, Marib, Aden, Taiz, Sana'a, and Hodeidah.
- Organized a workshop to review the "Localization and Humanitarian and Development Response Improvement Strategy in Yemen."
- Provided training on humanitarian advocacy and campaign planning to strengthen local capacities.
- Published a special study on corporate social responsibility practices in Yemen: assessing the private sector's role in humanitarian and development response.
- Established a digital platform to amplify the voices of local actors and develop innovative tools to raise awareness and stimulate dialogue on localizing humanitarian action in Yemen.




Corporate Social Responsibility: A recent study
assesses private sector engagement in humanitarian
and development response in Yemen

As part of the strategy to localise and improve response mechanisms in Yemen, funded by the Danish International Development Agency (DANIDA) and sponsored by the Danish Refugee Council (**DRC**) and the Tamdeen Youth Foundation (**TYF**), the study 'Assessing the Reality of Corporate Social Responsibility in Yemen: Private Sector Engagement in Yemen's Humanitarian and Development Response'.

The study provides a comprehensive analysis of private sector CSR initiatives and practices in Yemen, identifying internal and external challenges and opportunities.

The study is the first of its kind in Yemen and represents a valuable addition to efforts to achieve a more sustainable and locally-led response, providing practical recommendations for activating corporate social responsibility and enhancing the role of the private sector in responding to the humanitarian and development challenges facing Yemen.
