
Our Work



The Foundation works in the fields of (building the capacity of youth - Education - civil awareness and social peace - development in crisi - volunteering - rural development - women support and rehabili tation - community empowerment). It is currently focusing on contributing to facing the humanitari an crisis in Yemen by implementing projects: (emergency response - relief and shelter - food security-health and nutrition - WASH - improvement of livelihoods - mobilization and advocacy - early recovery - reconstruction)

The Foundation has the ability to access to targeted groups in all areas of Yemen. Its staff and field teams work in:

The Foundation's work is focused on Yemen. It implements its programs and projects in most of Yemeni cities and governorates. Its main administration is in Sana'a. It has three areas in Ibb, Aden and Al Hudaydah to manage its activities in the center and south of Yemen, as well as branch offices in Taiz and Al Hudaydah and temporary offices in the current project implementation areas. In early 2019, the Foundation also managed to open a regional office in the Jordanian capital "Amman". About 90% of our working staff is working in the field to provide services to the beneficiaries.

Preparedness and Rapid Response

In times of war and conflict, dreams and demands are fading and civilians wish only what keeps them alive. Tamdeen Youth Foundation is found in the most difficult places and conditions for saving lives and serving human being. It has emergency response teams that have been set up and qualified since 2015, with extensive skills and the ability to provide emergency support in record time. As a model, the foundation is an active partner of the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) in implementing the emergency response program for displaced persons from war and conflict areas in Yemen.

Food Security

Food security and livelihood program focuses on projects that break the cycle of poverty and meet emergency food needs. It also aims to implement projects to promote economic and social development, improve the lives of the most vulnerable groups, and motivate local communities toward the sustainable use of available resources. Since 2018, the Foundation has been working as an active partner with the World Food Program (WFP) and distributing food to tens of thousands of families threatened by hunger in a number of regions in Yemen.

WASH

WASH program aims to ensure sustainable access to water facilities, and to maintain a healthy life and a clean environment. Since 2015, in partnership with a number of donors, the most prominent is UNICEF, Tamdeen Youth Foundation provided clean drinking water to thousands of civilians affected by war and conflict in Yemen. The Foundation also provided tens of hospitals with clean water and is still implementing projects of water supply and securing its sources.

In addition, the foundation has actively contributed to the preservation of the environment and the protection of many population groups from epidemics and diseases that have spread under the humanitarian crisis in Yemen. This contribution was through a series of projects implemented by the foundation and still with its partners such as Care International and the Humanitarian Pooled Fund.



Water Distribution Project for Al-Gumhory Hospital and Yemeni - Swedish Hospital in Taiz Governorate





In February 2016, and because of the war circumstances, animals in Taiz zoo faced a real danger after food and medicine ran out to starve. 11 lions and 6 rare Arab tigers out of 31 died, as well as a number of animals, including the rare Arab (Maha) which the zoo has 18 of them. At that time, Tamdeen Youth Foundation launched a distress call to save the rest of the animals. The call was heard far away in Malmo, Sweden, where the scenes moved the heart of the animal-lover Chantal Yunkurjoo and started an online campaign to collect donations to provide food and medicine for animals. The effort succeeded in collecting \$33,000 in less than two weeks. It was received by the Italian organization Intersos, which involved Tamdeen Foundation in implementing the campaign's objectives. Employees' salaries were paid, animals were fed, and wounded lions and tigers because of fighting with each other on the crumbs, were treated. The foundation managed to save 280 animals in the zoo.

Mobilization and Advocacy

In 2016, through the mobilization and advocacy, Tamdeen Youth Foundation was able to alleviate the siege imposed on civilians in Taiz city in central Yemen.

The Foundation launched a global call to save the population and a campaign, in partnership with Hemmat Shabab Foundation, called "Loyalty to Taiz" which succeeded in influencing the parties to the conflict and opening humanitarian corridors. The success of the campaign was enhanced by the response of a number of international organizations that provided civilians with a convoy of humanitarian assistance. The two foundations coordinated the introduction and distribution of this assistance to the living facilities and the besieged civilians.

The result was as follows:

- * The enter of 6,000 baskets from the World Food Program (WFP) and the Islamic Relief Organization during January and February 2016.
- * 1350 washing of kidney failure patients in Al-Gumhory and Al-Thawrah Hospitals in the city .
- * The enter and distribution of quantities of medicines and 440 oxygen cylinders from the World Health Organization (WHO) to hospitals in the city.



Rescue of Taiz Zoo

In February 2016, Tamdeen Youth Foundation launched a media campaign through social media to save animals in Taiz zoo, which faced a real danger and several died after food and medicine ran out due to war and unrest. The campaign has received global interaction. The fund-raising started in coordination with the Italian organization Intersos, which was the first to interact. The foundation managed to save 280 animals in the zoo, and treat wounded lions and tigers because of fighting with each other on the crumbs. It paid employees' salaries too.

In addition, the Foundation has led many voluntary initiatives in the humanitarian and social peace fields. It also advocates the rights of women, children and marginalized groups and organizes activities to gain support for them. The United Nations is involved in the revival of international days and in the promotion of positive change

The Foundation uses social networks to raise awareness and mobilize so that everyone has the right to a better and decent life.



1 First Phase:

A consultative meeting of civil society organizations was held and came out with a draft of approach for community supervision and accountability, and starting to implement field survey and questionnaire to identify the performance of executive offices in Taiz (Communications, Electricity, Water, Cleaning Fund, Immigration and Passport Department, Traffic Police, Social Affairs and Labor, Finance and Taxation).

2 Second Phase:

Analyzing the data and information obtained from these authorities and check their transparency and impartiality.

3 Third Phase:

Joint meetings were held between the leaders of the service authorities targeted by the project with the local authority leaders and representatives of the community supervision teams of Tamdeen Youth Foundation.

The teams reported on the performance of these authorities, the monitoring results and the proposed recommendations. They also followed up on the implementation of the recommendations and launched an awareness campaign on transparency and anti-corruption.

Empowerment of Women

We, in Tamdeen Foundation, believe that the advancement of societies can only be achieved by activating their full potential, which women are half of them. Thus, the foundation provides equal opportunities for both genders to participate in its management and implementation of its programs, projects and activities. So, that the percentage of women working in the foundation is nearly half, while the percentage of female volunteers is higher than that of male. Since its establishment, the foundation has also been working to empower women and to implement projects and activities that contribute to helping them to develop themselves, to acquire knowledge, skills and confidence to participate in public life, and to integrate into development.





Youth Empowerment Program

Tamdeen Youth Foundation was founded with a voluntary youth initiative for civil society and sustainable development. Since its foundation in May 2013, the foundation has been working to empower and build youth as a priority, based on its belief that young people are the makers of change and lasting positive impact in their societies. Young men and women have been the basis of the preparation and implementation of the programs, projects and activities of the foundation, which enabled them to work and volunteer with in its programs, training courses, seminars, conferences and workshops, to serve the community through Tamdeen Foundation, whose services have reached millions in most of Yemen regions.

Thus, the foundation continues to build the capacity of Yemeni youth through its fields of work, as they are the base of development and effective change and the most prominent of its tools. They are also the voice of local communities to express their needs and fulfill their aspirations.





Youth Economic Empowerment Project

On June 29, 2019, Tamdeen Youth Foundation TYF signed a memorandum of understanding with the Skills Development Fund in Aden. The memorandum was intended to enroll unemployed youth in vocational and technical institutes, enable them to work, contribute to development and reconstruction in Yemen, and move them from the need to produce; while arrangements are being finalized to sign a similar memorandum of understanding in Sana'a. Simultaneously, in partnership with Care International, the foundation is preparing to implement a field survey of the labor market in each of (Sana'a - Aden - Taiz) preparing for the implementation of the project.

Project objectives:

Economic empowerment, improved livelihoods and sustainable development, as well as the provision of labor resources that meet the needs of the labor market and reconstruction of Yemen.

The project targets:

youth of both genders at age (18-30 years) if they are:

- Leaving primary or secondary education.
- Graduates of basic and secondary education who have discontinued their education or stopped continuing it because of the consequences of the war and the crisis that befell Yemen, or for special circumstances that made them feel the burden of looking for a source of livelihood for the family.
- University graduates who desire to qualify themselves and to acquire professional skills and better capabilities to build their future.

Project Benefits:

- Free training and qualification in specialized government vocational and technical institutes.
- Miscellaneous training in the professional and development fields in addition to the skills of managing small-scale income-generating projects.
- Free bag for every graduate.

Following up graduates and coordinating with the private sector to enable them to participate in the labor market and support their own projects.


Areas of rehabilitation and skills development:

(Construction- blacksmithing- carpentry - plumbing- mechanics- electricity- air conditioning and cooling- beauty- sewing- fashion design- nursing and midwifery)

Beneficiaries of the project:

7000 young men and women in the first phase.





Education Program:

More than 2 million children (boys and girls) are still out of school, mostly girls. According to UNICEF, the pre-eighth grade schools drop-out rate exceeds 40% for girls and more than 25% for boys, especially in rural areas.

In recent years, a series of armed conflicts have occurred in many parts of the country, leading to the displacement of hundreds of thousands of families and the destruction of basic services, including schools. This had led to increased school drop-out rates, especially for girls, and lower school enrollment rates for both boys and girls.

Program Objective:

To increase the enrollment of school-age children (girls and boys) among the most vulnerable groups in Yemen, and to improve equitable access to safe and comprehensive learning spaces in conflict-affected areas.

Education Projects:

Tamdeen Youth Foundation believes that education is the gateway to peace-building, and the window of hope to get out of the cycle of violence, poverty and conflict to a better future for Yemen and its children. The foundation dedicated 2020 to education, which it launched by mobilizing resources for the construction of three schools in the most deprived and densely populated areas of Taiz governorate (Omar Bin Al Khattab School in Ayfoua, Shara'ab Al Salam district, Al-Khair School in Bani Bukari, Jabal Habashy district; and a school for the people of the villages of She'ab Omarin, Al-Hwait and Haydhah in Samea district).



Volunteering and community participation

Tamdeen Youth Foundation was founded with a voluntary initiative to work for civil society and sustainable development. The foundation has launched its activities and programs by young men and women motivated by the desire to make positive change in their communities and devoting their efforts to help others.

Since volunteerism is the gateway to capacity-building and experience acquisition, the management of the foundation has established voluntary and community empowerment unit, so that volunteers have become a basis for to the implementation of its programs, projects and activities. The beneficiaries have also become an active partner in its success by helping them to elect their own community committees, form community councils and motivate self-initiatives. The communities targeted by the foundation have been able to manage their services and interests in a sustainable manner.
