## Who we are

**Started in 2011 as a voluntary youth group**, TYF is a civil, non-governmental and non-profit foundation. After a series of community activities, it was officially registered with the Ministry of Social Affairs and Labor on **March 25th, 2013**, with license **No. 312/ 2013**, and in accordance with Law **No. (1) of 2001**.

TYF seeks to support socio-economic interventions to create and secure adequate livelihood opportunities for members of society, and enable them to thrive, grow and participate in making immediate and long-term change, allowing everyone to live in peace and competence.

From the premise that recovery and development are integrated in their socio-economic dimensions, TYF launched its Strategic Plan **2021-2023**, covering broader development areas, targeting a larger segment of society and building on the alignment of humanitarian response, development and peace.

This strategy is the first step to transition from relief to development, ensuring the transition from financing for development to empowerment for development. This also will ensure that appropriate solutions are found to the challenges and risks that impede the effective participation of society, with a view to reducing its needs and enhancing its resilience to better respond to crises, thereby contributing to the achievement of sustainable development goals.

We benefit from the value of teamwork by sharing experiences, risks and resources to solve humanitarian problems



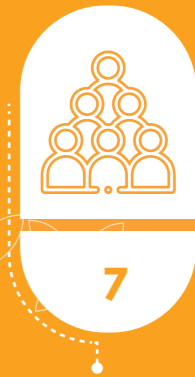
## 5 Innovation

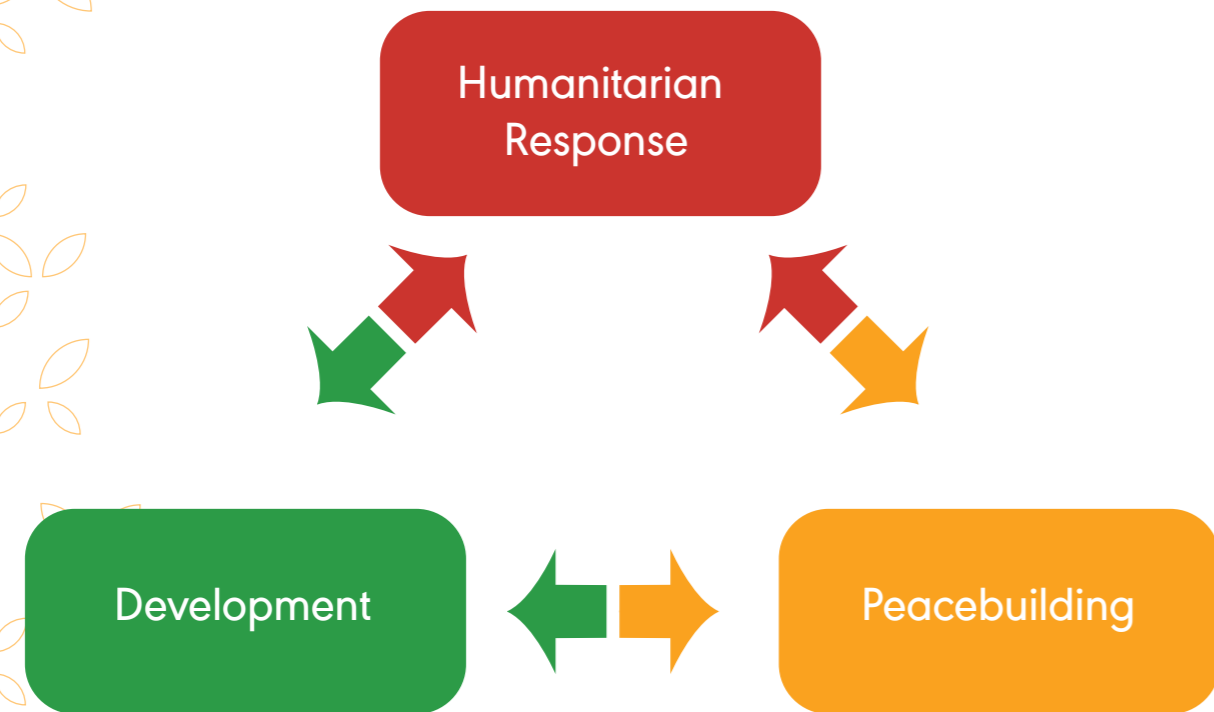

# TYF Strategic Events

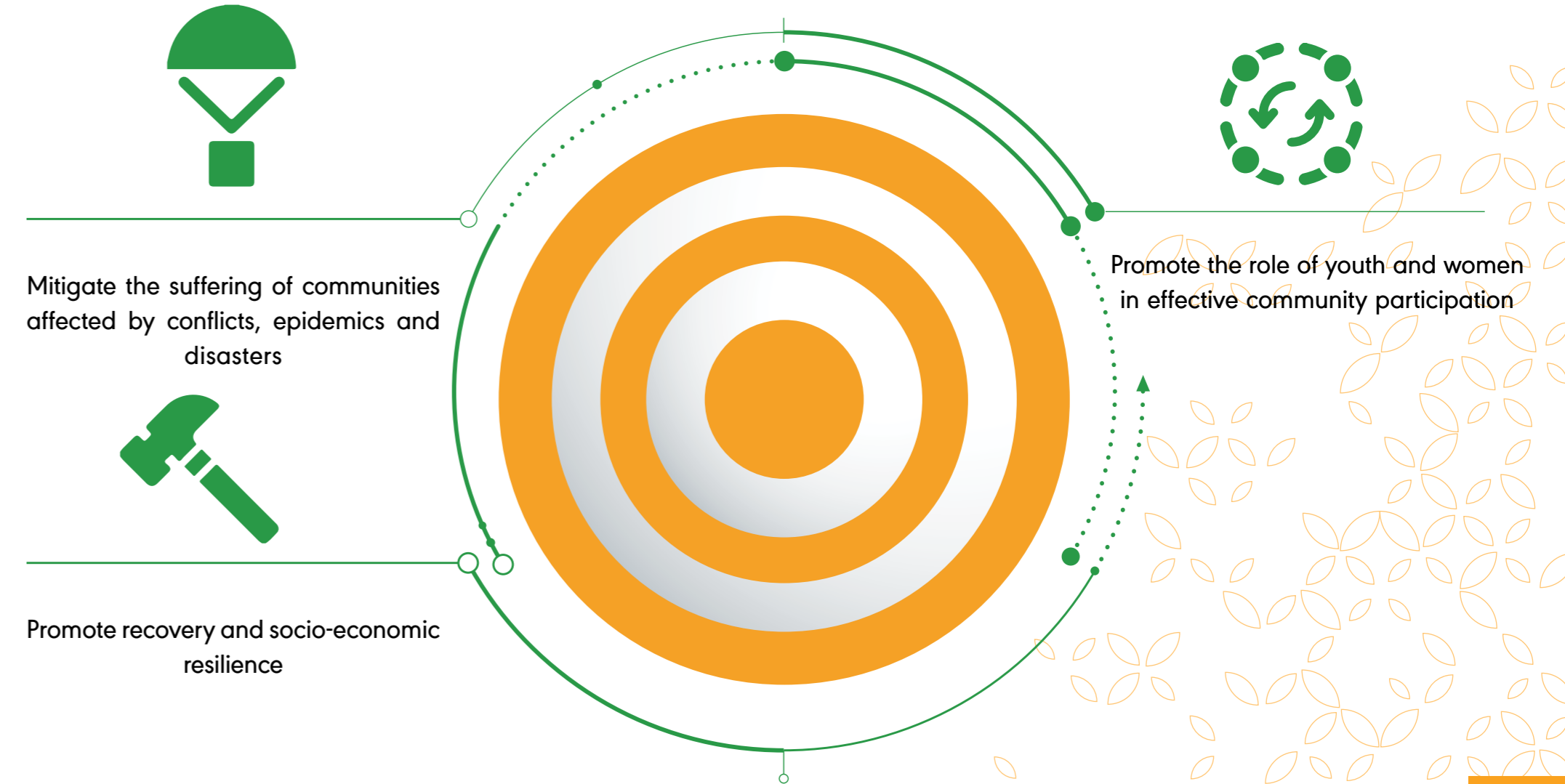

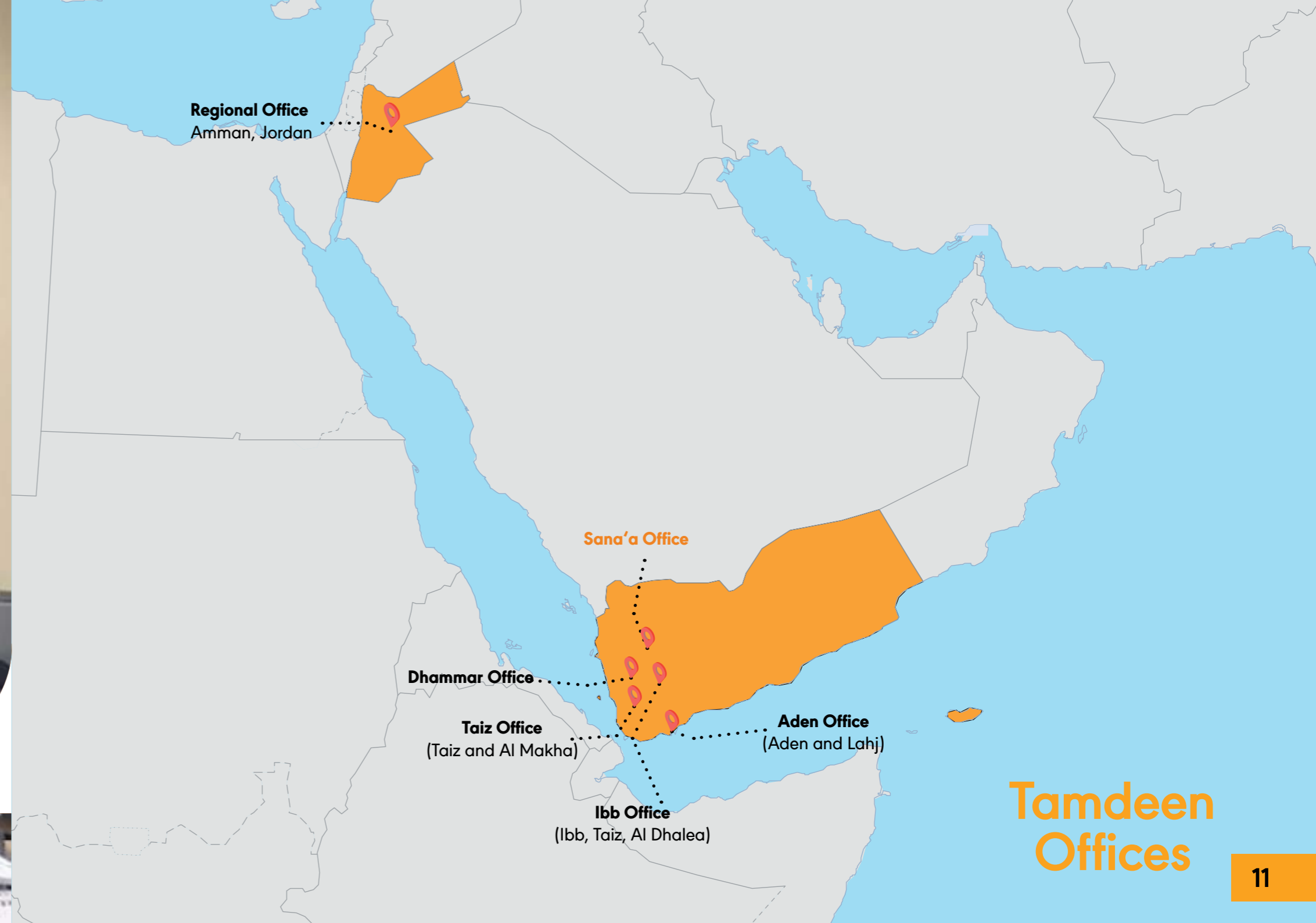
In 2020 TYF has adopted the Triple Nexus Approach (Humanitarian Aid, Development Cooperation, and Peacebuilding) in its programmatic strategy aiming to support the community in adapting and recovering quickly from the impact of the war in Yemen.

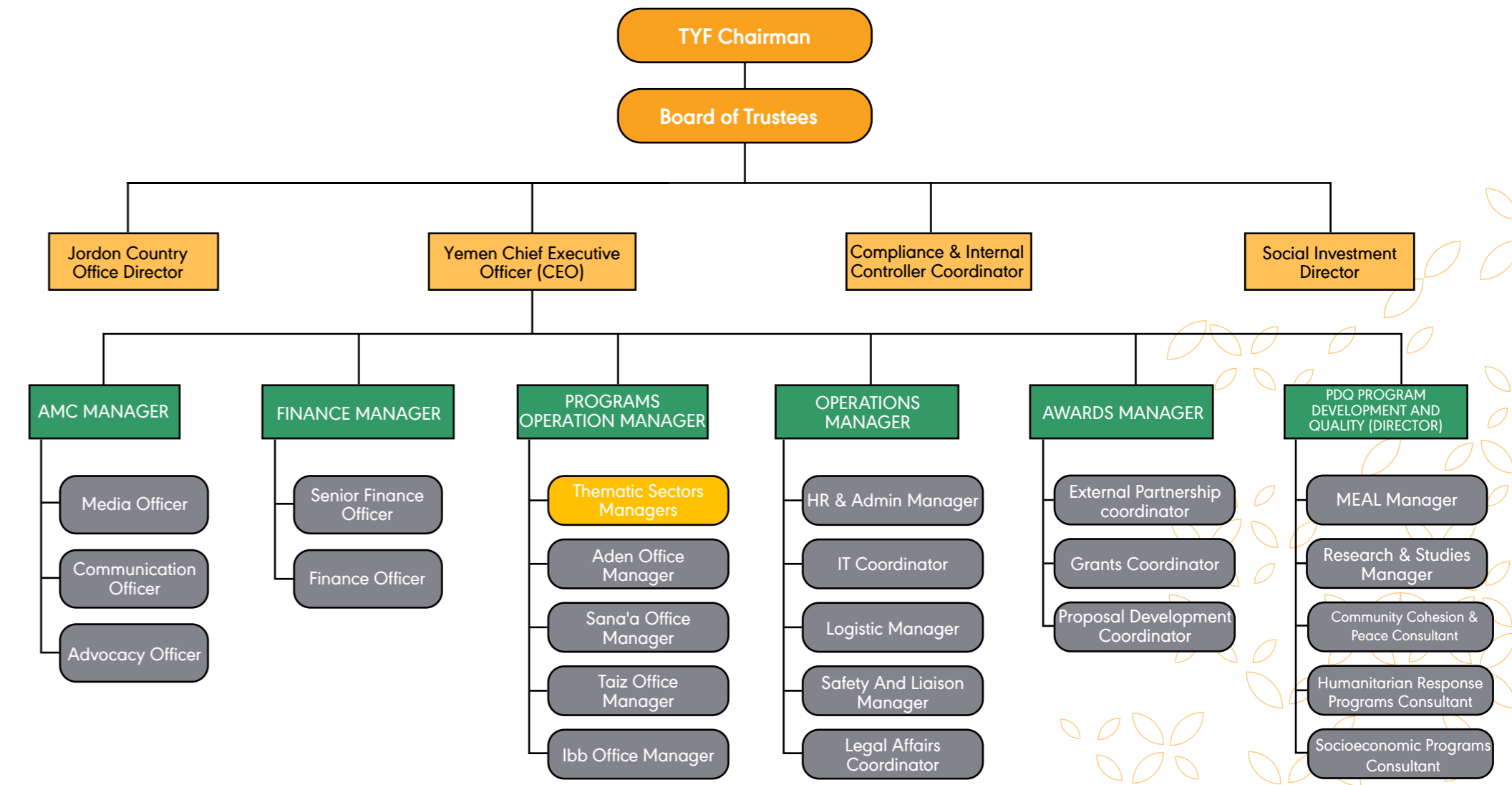

## Results-Based Management Strategic Approach (RBM):

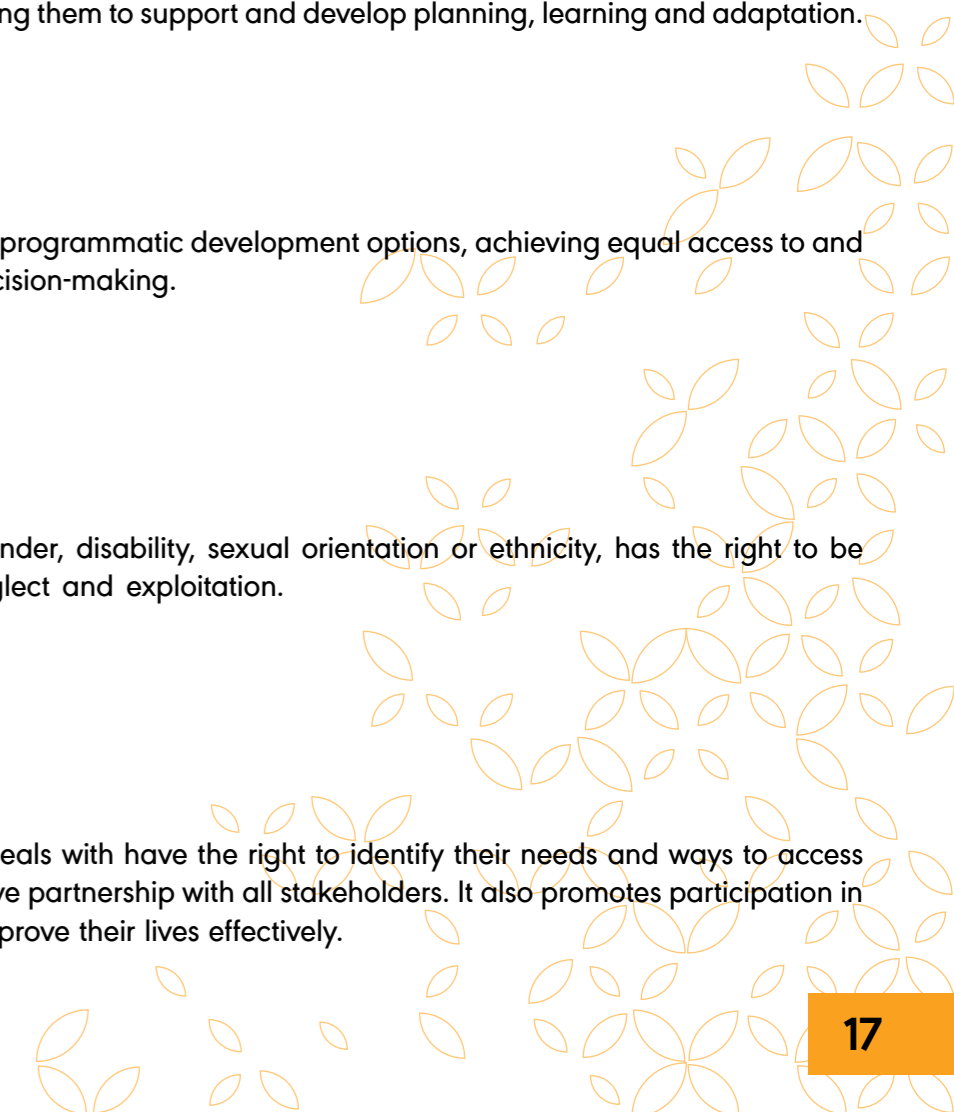
## Protection Mainstreaming

## Collaborative and Participatory Approach

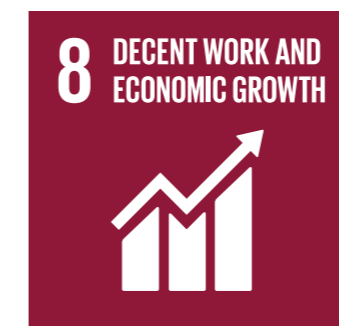

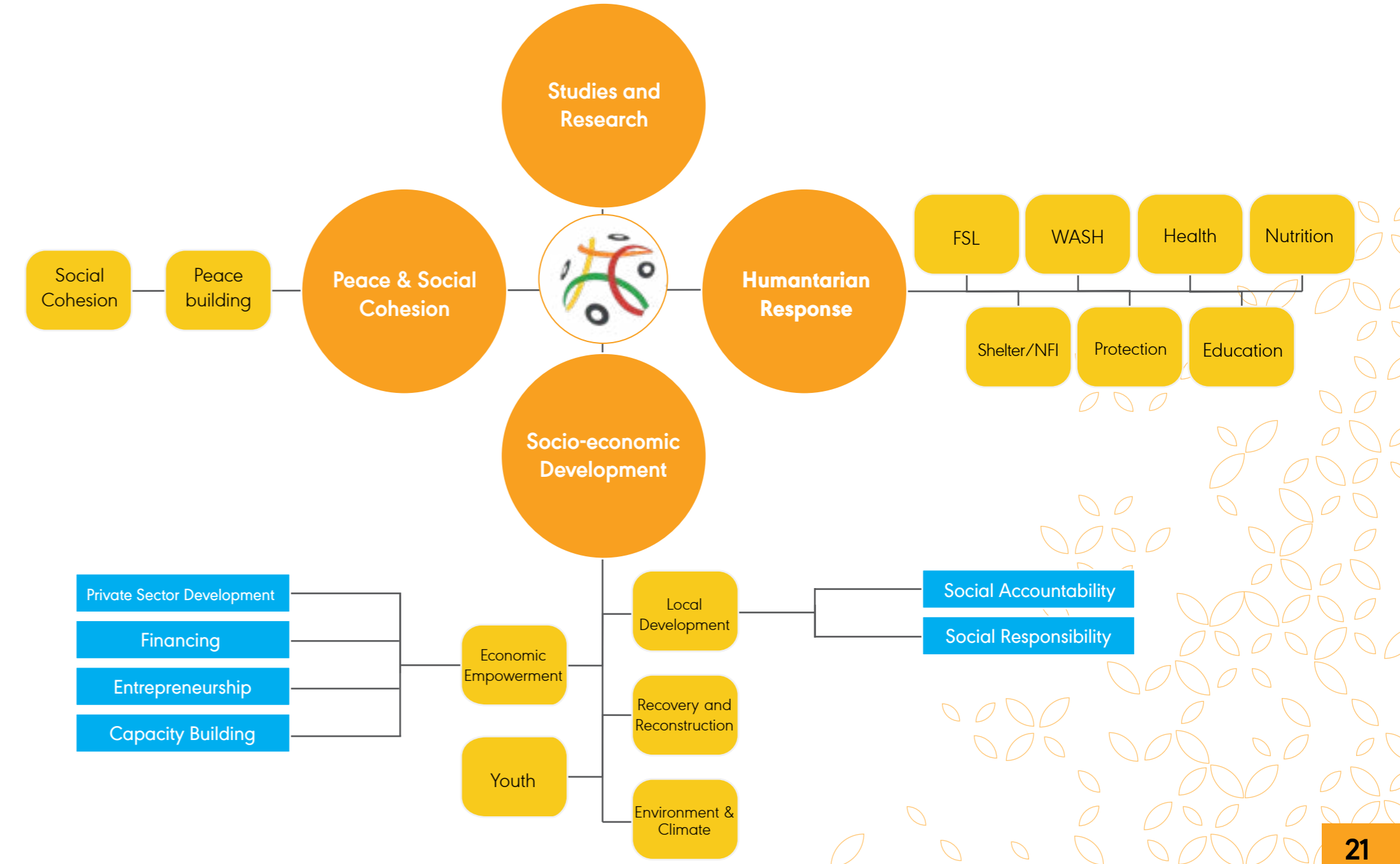

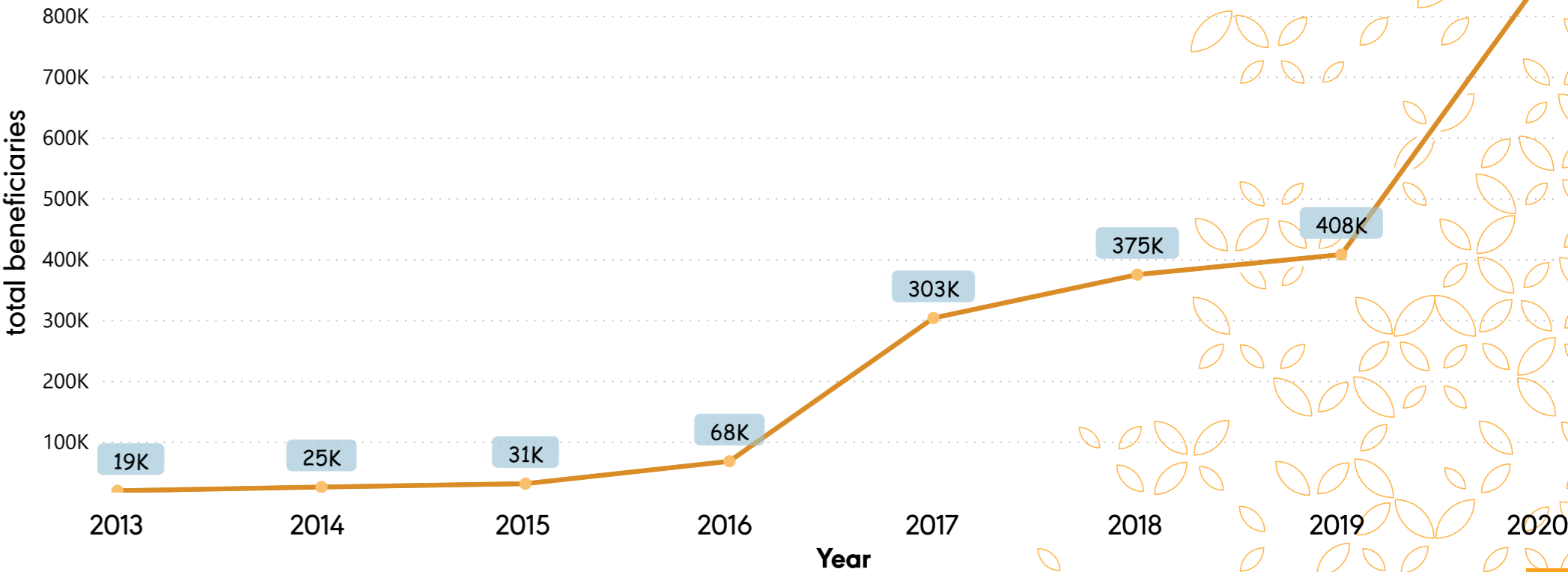

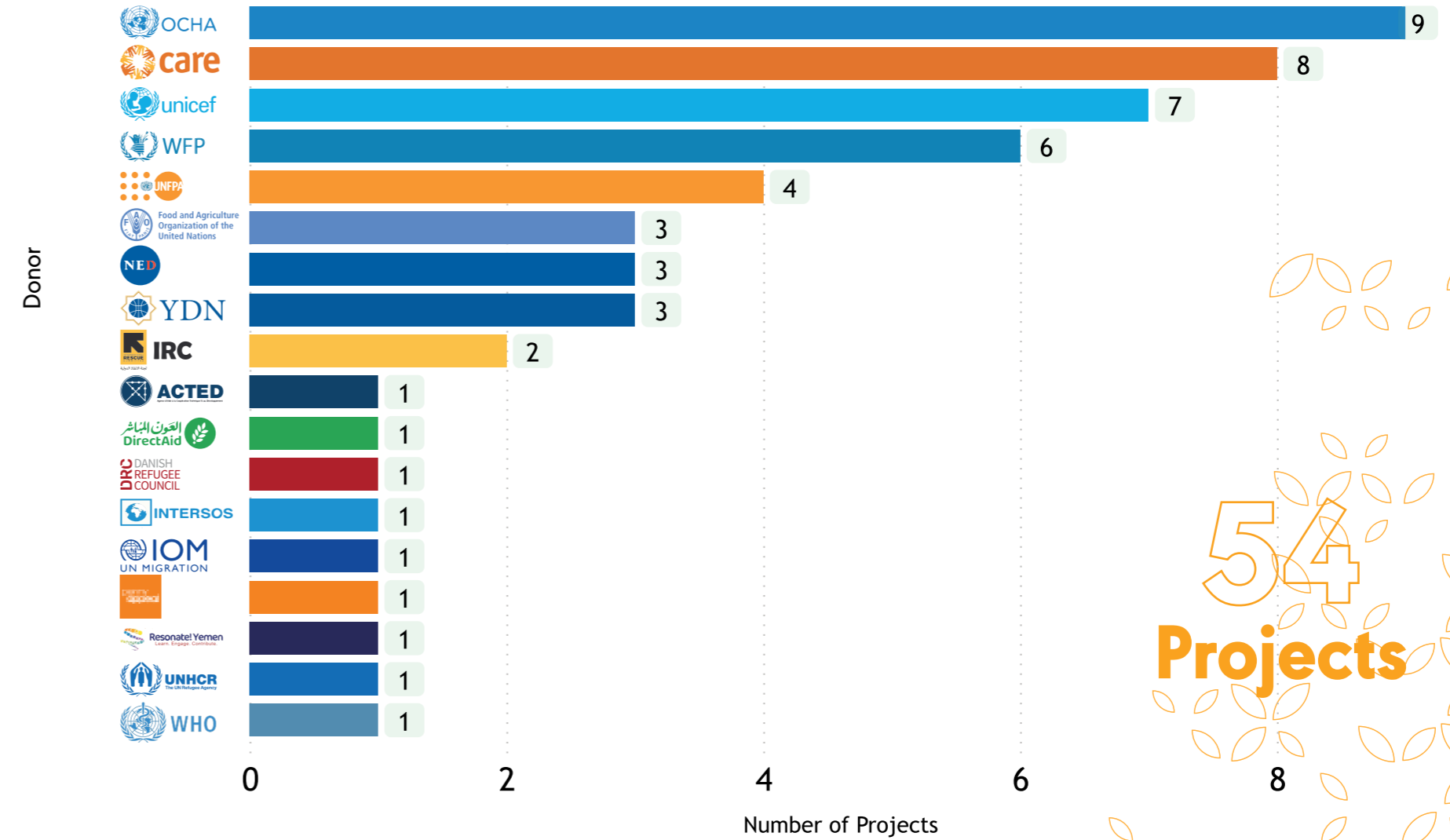
TYF Interventions

From 2013 to 2020, TYF was able to expand its emergency interventions to more than 58 districts in 11 Yemeni governorates. It also has active membership in all national and sub-national clusters in all areas of intervention. Moreover, it is a member of the Technical Working Groups (TWG) for several sectors, in particular, the Food Security and Livelihoods Sector (FSL), the Strategic Advisory Group (SAG), and the Shelter Technical Working Group (TWG Shelter).

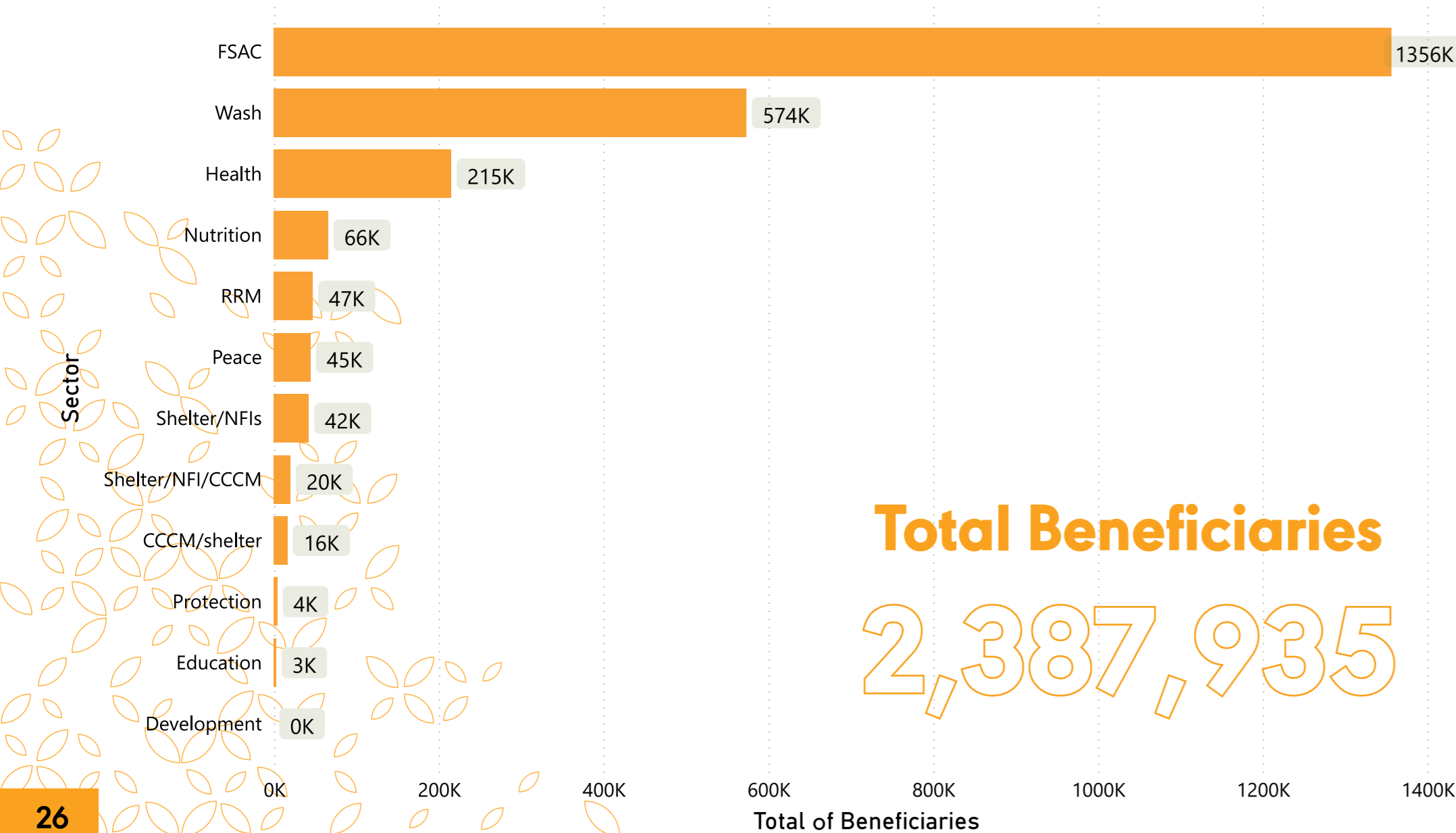

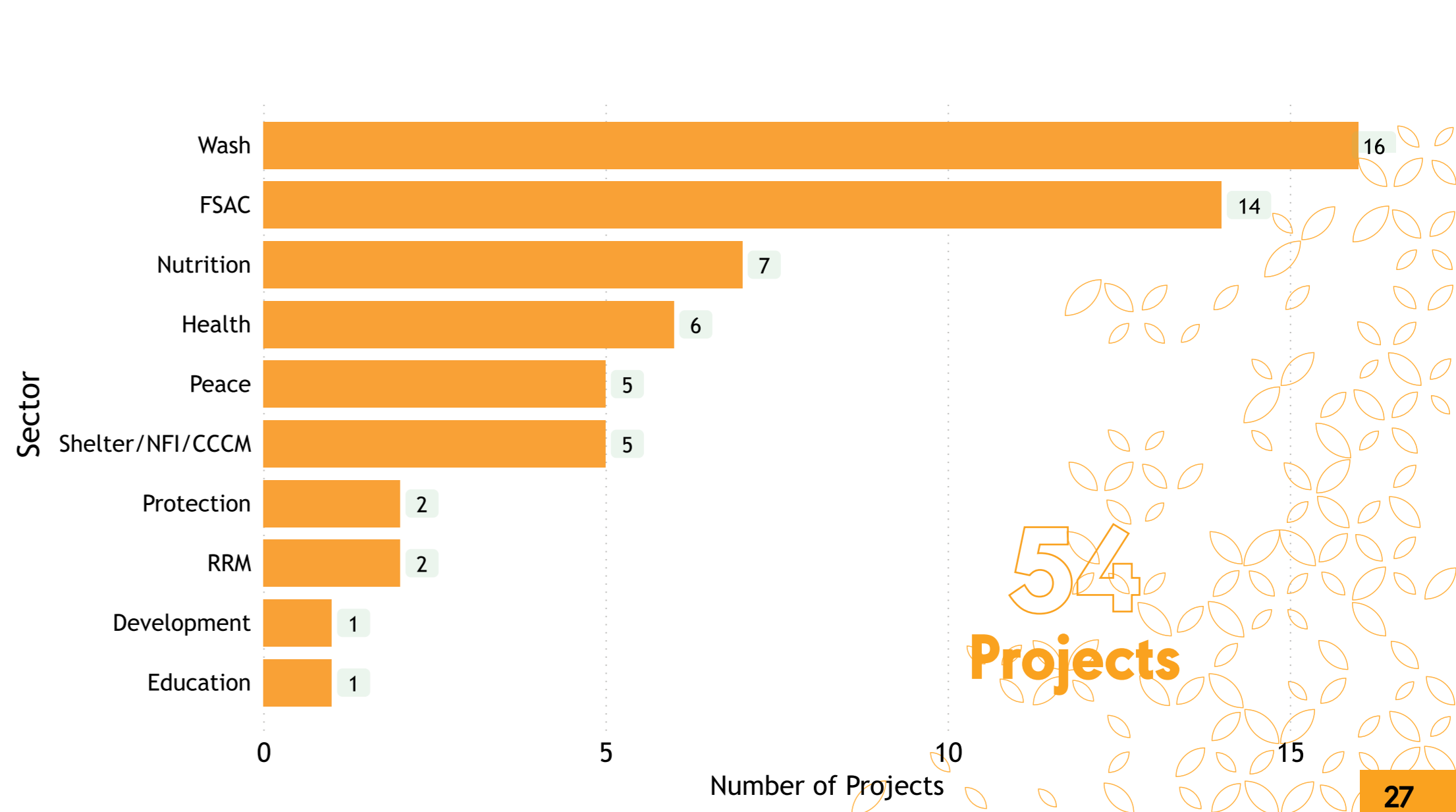
## Summary of projects by donor

## Summary of project interventions by sectors



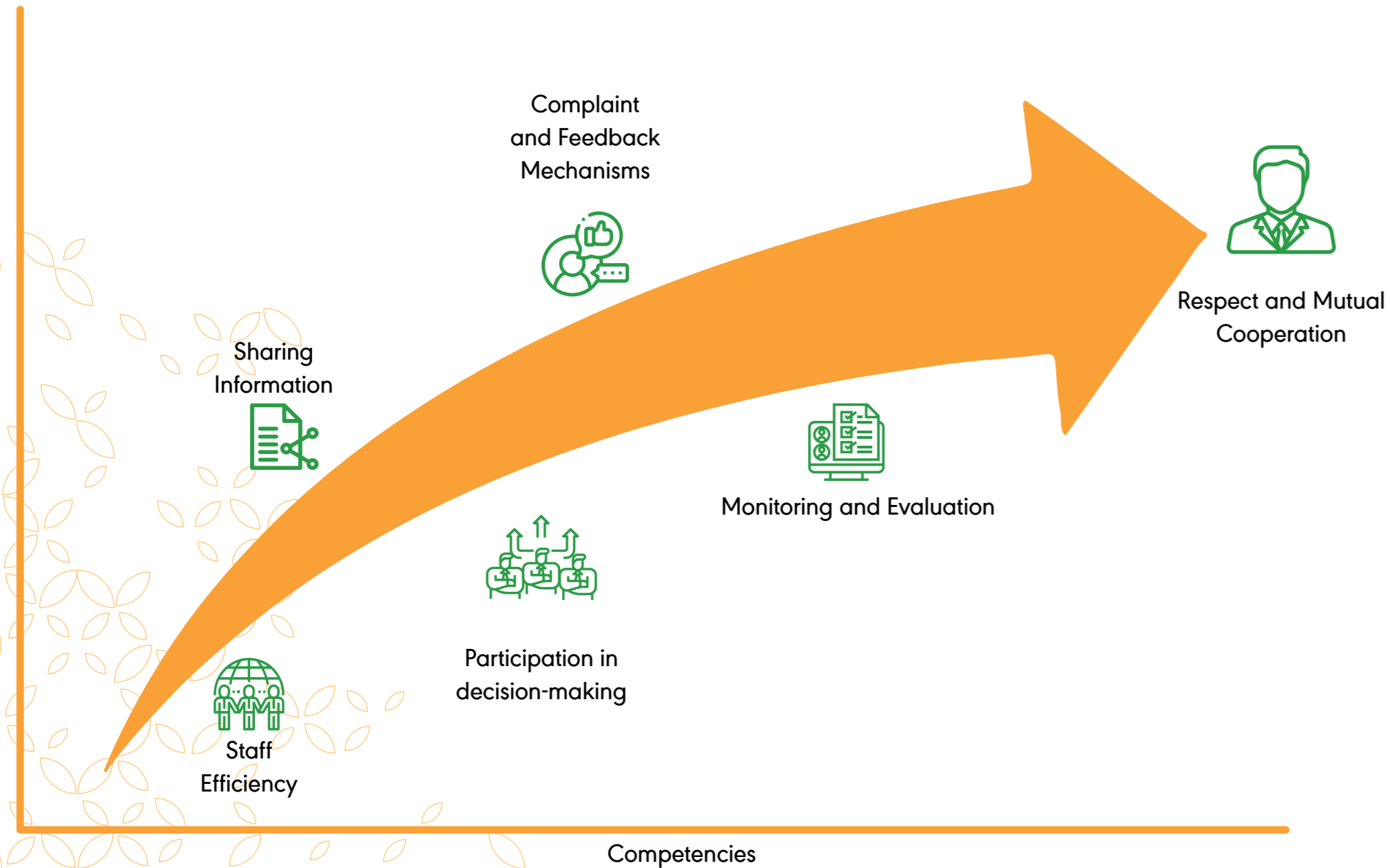
# Complaints and Suggestion System

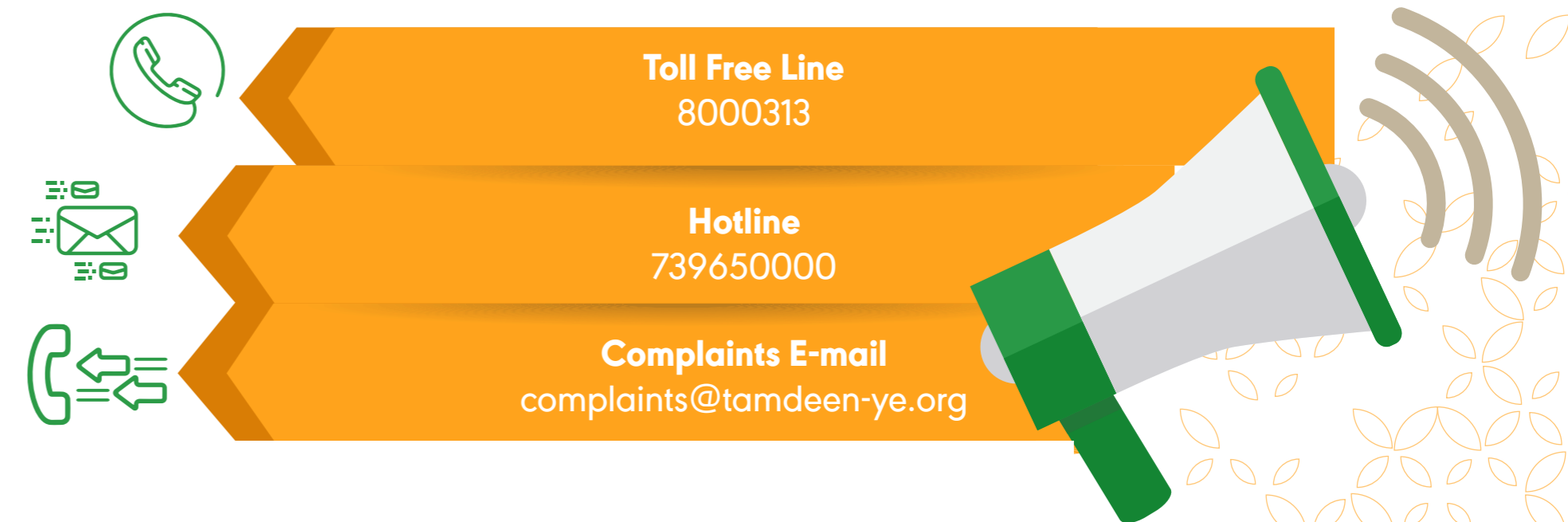
